WELLSBORO MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY MARCH 19, 2013

The meeting of the Wellsboro Municipal Authority was called to order by R. Robert DeCamp on March 19, 2013 in the Council Room of the John E. Dugan Fire Station/Municipal Building. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all who were present.

ATTENDANCE: Wellsboro Municipal Authority Members: R. Robert DeCamp, Ed Owlett, Dennison Young, Grant Cavanaugh, and Tom Reindl.

OTHER'S PRESENT: Councilor Joan S. Hart, Councilor Terry Bryant, Councilor Mike Wood, Borough Manager Daniel K. Strausser, Superintendent of Public Works Mark A. Dieffenbach, Secretary/Treasurer Susan L. Keck, and Natalie Kennedy from the Wellsboro Gazette.

MINUTES: Minutes of the February 19, 2013 meeting were approved by motion of Ed Owlett, seconded by Dennison Young, and carried 5-0.

SEWER PLANT PUMPS: Alan Zeigler reported on the screw pump failure and the new sewer pumps being ordered. The investment is exceeding \$100,000, not including labor, to date. To replace one screw pump would be a cost of \$225,000.00. We are able to purchase three of the sewer pumps for \$57,667.20. If one of the two remaining screw pumps becomes inoperable, it would require a 24 hour operator to keep the remaining pump operable.

ELECTRIC BIDS FOR FILTER PLANT: One filter plant building electric bid came in: Kevin Borden at \$24,750.00. A motion to approve the labor for the project at \$24,750.00 out of the gas lease revenue was made by Ed Owlett, seconded by Denny Young, carried 5-0.

GAS BID FOR FILTER PLANT BUILDING: The UGI, Central Penn Gas, Inc. fee to provide natural gas service for the generator and two heaters with the Borough digging the trench came in at \$6,199.00, with the funds to be taken out of the gas lease revenue. This was accepted by motion of Tom Reindl, seconded by Grant Cavanaugh, carried 5-0. Dan Strausser is authorized to sign and accept for the Authority.

TIMBER SALE OUT FOR BID: Grant Cavanaugh made a motion to put the timber sale out for bid. This was seconded by Tom Reindl and carried 5-0.

WATER LOANS: We're looking into paying off/down as much of the existing water loans as possible, then utilizing the unused LOC of \$500,000 if we run into a short fall.

BILLS: Monthly loan payments and bills were authorized for payment in the following amounts by motion of Ed Owlett, seconded by Denny Young, and carried unanimously.
